Quick Overview

Participating teachers:

- Receive (2) Capture Thought Virtual Classroom units to keep free of charge
- Receive optional free Zoom training from the creators of Capture Thought
- Choose 1-2 students to use Capture Thought along with you in your class
- Share positive Capture Thought experiences on their social media channels/networks
- Give feedback to us to improve the overall experience via short google forms survey

Goals of the Pilot Program

- To support teachers in using Capture Thought with their students
- To inspire teachers and spread awareness of Capture Thought as an integral part of the learning process

Teacher Support

Materials

- Teachers will be sent two (2) Capture Thought units free of charge to keep for participating in our pilot program. Teachers can choose which colors they want (Black/Blue/Pink). We will send them free of charge via USPS approximately two weeks before the program begins. One is intended for you, and the other is intended for your students or you can use them both with two students of your choosing.

Optional Training / Brainstorming / Planning

- Teachers are invited to an initial Zoom training before the start of the program to learn best practices, synchronous learning, and asynchronous learning techniques, but this is not required.
- Teachers are supported via additional Zoom training as needed upon request.
- All Zoom training will be conducted by Joe DiOrio, teacher and inventor of Capture Thought and Dr. Drew Ishii Sage Hill School Department Chair, creator of Formative Assessment Rubric.
